Found - 1929 GLO Brass Cap set in Rock, properly marked.
Orig. 20", now 24" Fir, alive, N.47°E. (Rec N.57°E.) 17.2 ft. shows good scar, we do not open.
Orig. 44", now 48" Fir, dead, S.45°E. 66.7 ft., shows scar, don't open.
Orig. 10", now 10" Yew, dead, S.33°W. 33.0 ft., scribe visible on unhealed blaze.
Orig. 30", now 32" Fir, alive, N.37°W. 16.5 ft., shows good scar.
New BTs- 9" D.Fir S.43°W. 18.0 ft. mkd. T26S R2E S27 CS BT.
9" D.Fir S.22°E. 21.7 ft. mkd. T26S R2E S26 CS BT.
Note - This corner lies on steep, easterly slope 25 ft. E. of bottom of 20 ft. high bluff.
