

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION Cor. No. 5 HES 229

Alias	Description

HES No. 229 by Geo. W. Root, Forest Service Surveyor, under special instructions dated March 17, 1917 - Surveyed Oct. 1917 - DCSO records Vol. 28 Page(s) 12183-4)

Cor. No. 7 of listing survey, 20 ft. above point of ascent which I now destroy and in its place establish cor. No. 5 of this survey as follows:
Set a diorite stone, 24x10x10", 14" in the ground, over a stone marked with a cross for cor. No. 5 of this survey marked 5 HES 229 on side facing the claim, from which
 A fir, 15" dia., bears N.51°15'W., 9 lks. mkd X5HES 229 BT
 A fir, 12" dia., bears N.48°30'E., 8 lks. mkd X5HES 229 BT
Dig pits, 24x24x12", crosswise on this and the succeeding course, 7 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. dist., within the claim.

Cor. No. 5, HES No. 229, which is a stone, 8x10x12", above ground, & mkd & witnessed as described in the official record

Found - Corner stone, in place, mkd: "X" on top & "5 HES 229" on side facing claim.
 Orig. 15", now 19" Fir, alive, N.51°15'W., 5.9 ft., shows good scar. Rescribe: "5 HES 229 CS BT"
 Orig. 12, now 16" Fir, alive N.48°30'E., 5.3 ft., shows good scar. Rescribe: "5 HES 229 CS BT"

At cor. point in place of old cor. stone.
Set - 1" I.P. & brass cap mkd "COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE 1969 T26S COR. #5 HES \ 229 R2E". Reset stone alongside.

This cor. lies on top of low rounded spur, sloping gently NE.

Found - 1" galvanized iron pipe, iron pipe, per 1969 ren., with 2½" brass cap, (properly) mkd, from which:
 A 21" D.Fir, healed scars, bears N.47°00'W., 6.2' (rec. N.51°15'W., 5.94' per HES 229)
 A 19" D.Fir, healed scars, bears N.52°45'E., 5.3' (rec. N.48°30'E., 5.28' per HES 229)
 A 10"x11"x17" stone marked "5 HES 229" lies along side the pipe.
