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HES No. 182 by Frederick W. Rase, Forest Service Surveyor, under special instructions dated January 7, 1916 - Surveyed Aug. 1916 - DCSO records Vol. 28 Page(s) 12174)

Cor. No.2 (250 ft. above ravine) identical with cor. No. 2 of listing survey, which I destroy, and in its place Set a granite stone 24x13x10", 14" in the ground, over a stone mkd. with a cross for cor, No. 2 of this survey, Mkd. 2 HES 182 on side facing the claim, from which -.
A fir, 36" dia., bears S.29°20'W., 168 lks., marked X 2 HES 182 BT.
No other bearings available. Pits impracticable. Raise a mound of stone 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft., within the claim.
Lookout Mt. bears S.64°W., approximately 6 miles dist.

Note - Brass cap set in mound of stone 3 ft. in dia., & 2 ft. high.
