HES No. 182 by Frederick W. Rase, Forest Service Surveyor, under special instructions dated January 7, 1916 - Surveyed Aug. 1916 - DCSO records Vol. 28 Page(s) 12175)

Cor. No. 4 (50 ft. below top of spur) identical with cor. No. 4 of listing survey, which I destroy, and in its place. Set a conglomerate stone 26x15x7", 16" in the ground, over a stone mkd. with a cross for cor. No. 4 of this survey, mkd. 4 HES 182 on side facing the claim, from which

- A fir, 48" dia., bears N.69°45'W., 36 lks., mkd: X 4 HES 182 BT.
- A fir, 40" dia., bears N.26°30'W., 65 lks., mkd: X 4 HES 182 BT.

Raise a mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft. within the claim.

Orig. 48", now 52" Fir, alive, N.69°45'W., 23.8 ft., shows good scar, we tag. Orig. 40", now 50" Fir, N.26°30'W., 49.5 ft (Rec. 42.9) or 10 lk. difference. Alive, shows good scar, we tag.

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A 23"x16"x8" sandstone, marked "4 HES 182", bears East 1.0', lying on its side;
An earth mound bears west 3.5'
A 48" D.Fir, good scar, bears N.72°40'W., 24.2' (record N.69°45'W., 23.76' per HES 182);
A 44" D.Fir, good scar, bears N.29°45'W., 50.2' (record N.26°30'W., 42.90' per HES 182)
An 8" D.Fir, scribing visible, bears N.20°20'E., 25.4' (record N.21°E., 25.5' per 1969 Ren.)
A 6" D.Fir, scribing visible, bears S.87°40'E., 19.2' (record S.87°E., 19.2' per 1969 Ren.)
