Set post, 3 ft. long, & 3" sq., 24" in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S on N face, from which:
A hemlock, 20" dia., bears N.18°E., 21 lks., mkd: ¼ S BT.
A fir, 7" dia., bears S.21½°E., 37 lks., mkd: ¼ S BT.

Set a 2" sq. fir stake by single proportion. (Using Staff compass & abney slope chain)

Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 5 & 8, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the orig. corner. Set an iron post, 28 long, 2½" dia., 20" in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, to top, with brass cap marked:
