Set 1/4 sec. post, around which a mound of stones were raised, as per instructions.

The 1/4 sec.cor. on North side of Sec. 21, is described as a mound of stones with no witnesses though surrounded with large timber. E. Wimberly and others were at this corner when the original stake was in existence and set a new stake at precise point where original stake stood. I find stake set by Wimberly still standing and renew this corner by two new witness trees for description of which, see "Book of new witnesses to U S Corners Page 9" (I do not know what and where this "book" is located,- V.L. July, 1992)

Two old post lying on ground.  
I took for position of this corner, a point from which the old witness trees as made by Britt bears as follows:  
Red Cedar 16" dia., bears S.70°20'W., 22 lks. dist.  
Red Cedar 24" dia., bears N.65°40'E., 44 lks. dist.

The 1/4 sec. cor. determined at record bearing & distance from the bearing trees established by Arthur Boyer, County Surveyor during his original corner perpetuation in 1933:  
from which Boyer's bearing trees  
A Cedar snag, 27" dia., bears N.65 3/4°E., 44 lks. dist. with healed blaze.  
A Cedar 22" dia., bears S.70°W., 22 lks. dist., with a burned center and old axe marks.  
(Note: I believe the above not to be Boyer's but is trees established by Germond in 1908. I found no Boyer records for this 1/4 Corner - V.L. July 1992)
