Original - GLO survey, Subd. Sec. 9 by Fred Mensch Under Special Instructions dated July 14, 1924 (DCSO records, Volume 11 Page 4413)

Set an Iron post, 3 ft. long, 1" dia., 27" in the ground, for special meander cor., with brass cap marked:

from which

- A Fir 8" dia., bears S.83°W., 57 lks. mkd. S 9 S M C B T.
- A Fir 18" dia., bears N.9°W., 51 lks mkd. S 9 S M C B T.

This Meander corner is on the N-S center line of Sec. 9, approx. 190 ft. South of the S 1/16 cor.

Found - 1924 BTs as follows:

- 8" now 13" Fir S.83°W., 37.6 ft. now down, open & shows scribe marks.
- 18" now 25" Fir N.9°W., 33.7 ft. alive, shows good scar.

No trace of 1924 GLO brass cap.

Set 1" I.P. & brass cap mkd. County Surveyors T26S R3W MC S9 Office, 1971

This corner falls at the base of a 42" D.Fir and on the north side. 1924 GLO brass cap probably washed out by high water.

Found - 2½" dia., brass cap on 1¼" O.D. I.P. (properly mkd) projects 11" above ground.

Note - BC/IP is set into the wood at the base of a 42" dia., double top D.Fir. Tree is on bank of river completely undermined by erosion & leans southerly toward river.

BT - 18" now 31" dia., D.Fir, old blaze visible, bears N.13°W., 33.7 ft (Rec. N.9°W., 33.7 ft) 1924 BT

Alias	Description

New - 24" D.Fir, bears N.22½°E., 55.2 ft. Note: Tree has healed blaze facing approx. N.15°W., & has BLM BT tag dated Sept. 1972 stating direction N.15dW., 135 lks., to cor. Probable cor. is AP 1 for power reserve, which position falls in N. Umpqua Hwy - no rec. for this tree.  
2½" dia. GLO brass cap flush w/ground marking CS 1/16 cor. sec. 9 bears N.0°56'W., 188.2 ft.  
Note - Compass decl. 16¼°E.
