Set post, from which  
    A B.Oak 12" dia. bears N.65°W., 126 lks.  
    A W.Oak 10" dia. bears S.5°E., 185 lks.

J.W. Cole, Co. Surveyor - Richardson, chain. - Feb. 1923

Set a sandstone 10 x 10 x 18" marked on N.E. side Cl. 49  
C.S. + on top from which  
    Stump of orig BT bearing scribe marks bears S.5°E., 122'  
    Marked New BTs as follows, Cl. 49 C.S.B.T.:  
        W.Oak 12" S.52°W., 52.6 ft.  
        W.Oak 36" S.81°E., 104 ft.  
Tree NW has been grubbed out. Old fence lines converge at  
this point. A new N. and S. fence built upon a line  
established by M.B. Germond bears East 35 ft.

Found - 10" x 10" x 18" sandstone and both BTs as scribed  
        in 1923, show old blazes. I do not cut out.  
        Both check for bearings & distances.  
Set 1" x 30" Iron pipe with brass cap mkd: SW Cor. D.L.C. 49  
    T29S R4W County Surveyors Office 1955.  
Reset sandstone alongside brass cap.  
Blazed and scribed:  
    6" W.Oak N.86½°E., 6.0 ft. S W Cl 49 CS BT.

Doug. Co. Surveyors Office - Stephen J. Flause; Bill Stewart  
August 7, 1980 - C.S. 61/11-13  
-----  
Found - 1955 DCSO brass cap on a 1" x 30" I.P. firmly set,  
        leaning slightly west & protruding 15" above  
        ground. Cap mkd. T29S.  
    A 10" x 10" x 18" sandstone set on the northeast  
        edge of the B/C, marked "CL 49 CS" on its NE  
        face & mkd. "X" on its top face.  
Search for orig. BTs is fruitless; apparently old road work  
in area destroyed evidence of these trees.  
    A 12" W.Oak now 25" bears S.51°W., 52.6 ft. (Record  
        S.52°W.) This tree has a well healed blaze, we  
        partially open to find scribing "L 49".

A 36" W.Oak now 46" bears S.81°E., 104.0 ft. (as per record) Tree has well healed blaze, we partially open to find scribing "CS".  
A 6" now 9" W.Oak bears N.82°E., 6.3 ft. (Rec. 6 ft.) We partially open the well healed double blaze to find scribing "BT".  
Set - Because all found bearing tree locations agree closely to record, the location of the brass cap & sandstone monument is accepted as good. Because brass cap has wrong township marking, we RESTAMP it to read "T26S" and add the marking "RESTAMP 1980".  
New BT - A 13" D.Fir bears N.34°W., 42.5 ft. & scribed "SW CL 49 CS BT" on a double blaze.  
All trees are tagged with DCS0 BT tags. A North-South fenceline is approx. 2.2 ft. East of the Brass cap.

Found - 1955 DCS0 brass cap, iron pipe, protrudes 15" out of ground. 1923 stone is along NE edge of BC/IP. N-S fence line 2' east of corner.  
36" W.Oak now gone, replaced by property owner with a metal fence post & attached BT tag. Post bears S.82½°E., 104 ft. (1923 BT rec. S.81°E., 104 ft) property owner set fence post in root hole of fallen Oak.  
12" now 26" dia., W.Oak with a healed blaze bears S.51°W., 52.6 ft. (1923)  
6" now 10" dia., dead W.Oak bears N.82°E., 6.3 ft. (1955)  
13" now 18" dia., D.Fir with a fully healed double blaze, bears N.34°W., 42.5 ft. (1980)  
New - Double trunked W.Oak double blazed & scribed "WSW DLC 49 CS BT" on 15" easterly trunk. Center of E'ly trunk bears N.21½°E., 27.9 ft.
