No trees near west of line. Corner lies 4 ft. south of E & W  
fence line, and just east of top of bald, grassy ridge.

Found - 2½" dia. 1964 DCSO brass cap on a 1¼" O.D. iron pipe  
protruding 14" above ground. BC/IP leans 6"  
north of plumb.

24" now 36" dia. B.Oak is down shows a previously  
opened blaze, no scribing visible. Root hole  
bears S.65°E., 372.9 ft. (Rec. S.63°E.)orig BT.

18" now 20" dia. W.Oak with a fully healed double  
blaze, bears S.50°E., 322.8 ft. (agrees w/rec.)

20" now a double trunked 2 ft. high D.Fir stump with  
a 20" east & a 13" west trunk, no blazes or  
scribing visible, bears N.81½°E., 320.0 ft.

New BTs - A triple trunked W.Oak double blazed & scribed "T26S  
R4W S7 CS BT" on 14" NW trunk, root crown bears  
S.64°E., 278.6 ft.

14" W.Oak double blazed & scribed "T26S R4W S6 CS  
BT" bears N.88½°E., 335.5 ft.

7" W.Oak double blazed & scribed T26S R4W S7 CS BT  
bears S.78½°E., 396.6 ft.

Corner lies 4 ft. south of an E-W running fence lines, &  
approx. 100' E. of a N'easterly-S'westerly bald grassy ridge.
