Found - Stump hole & rotten, down Oak S.27¼°E., 71.9 ft. opened & found good reverse scribing on old slab.
Stump hole & rotten remains of old Oak S.71°W., 25.7 ft. all reverse scribing visible on old slab.
Rotten remnants of old Madrone N.37°W. (not N.70½°W) 28.4 ft., overgrowth of 2 old axe scars found, but no scribing.
No trace found of original NE tree.
