Found - 1962 C. S. Brass Cap set in mound of stone 2 ft. high, 1962  
Orig. 30" D.Fir, alive, S.79°E. 30.4 ft., opened blaze, pitched & healing.  
Orig. 24" D.Fir, alive, S.39°W. 35.6 ft., shows good scar.  
Orig. N.E. and N.W. Bearing Trees down.  
New BTs- 20" R.Fir S.17°E., 31.1 ft., mkd: T27S R2W S12 CS BT  
22" D.Fir N.6°W., 11.3 ft. mkd: T27S R2W S2 CS BT.  
8" Yew N.35°E. 27.1 ft. mkd: T27S R2W S1 CS BT.  
14" R.Cedar blazed but not scribed bears South 14.0'  
Left bank of creek 10 ft. wide, flowing N. curving to N.W. bears East 42.0 ft. and same creek bears North 38.0 ft.

The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, & 12, perpetuated & recorded by Milo E. Godfrey, Deputy Co. Surveyor, in 1962, further perpetuated & recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy Co. Surveyor, in 1968, monumented with an iron post, 1¼" dia., firmly set, projecting 12" above ground, in a mound of stone, 3½ ft. base, 1½ ft. high, with brass cap (properly) mkd. from which the remains of an orig. BT  
A cedar root crown, bears N.20°W., 24 lks., with a downed cedar alongside, 36" dia., no marks visible.  
and BTs mkd. by Roberts in 1905-07  
A fir, 32" dia., bears S.76°E., 46 lks., with healed blaze. (Rec. S.79°E.)  
A fir, 28" dia., bears S.39°W., 54 lks. with healed blaze. and BTs mkd by Tracy in 1968  
A yew, 8" dia., bears N.36°E., 41 lks., with scribe marks T27S R2W S1 CS BT visible on open blaze.  
A G.Fir, 21" dia. bears S.15°E., 47 lks. with healed blaze  
A Fir, 22" dia., bears N.6°W., 18 lks., with healed blaze.  
The cor. is located in NW cor. of logged area, edge bears E & S.40°W.
