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<p>Original - Elder & Gile Contract #31 dated April, 1853 ----- Set ¼ Sec. post, from which A W. Oak 8" dia. bears N.16½°W., 192 lks. dist. A Y. Oak 16" dia. bears S.30 ¾°E., 497 lks. dist.</p>
<p>Edwin S. Woodford - November, 1955 - C.S. 42/64 ----- Black Oak BT to Southeast still standing - has been chopped out and rotting but scribe marks still visible. White Oak stump to Northwest hollow but reverse scribe marks visible inside. Set - 1" x 30" steel shaft for corner. Old BTs - Y.Oak, 16" bears S.30 ¾°E., 497 lks. W.Oak, 8" N.16½°W., 192 lks. stump now. New BT - 22" B.Oak, N.81½°W., 33.5 ft. The west pole of COPco tower No. 17, (Winchester-Roseburg line) bears N.19½°E., 7.5 ft. from corner.</p>
<p>Found OK, 11/29/70 - Tagged NW BT. J.M.P. - C.S 54/23-14</p>
<p>Douglas Co. Surveyors Office - Randall Smith; Stephen Flause; April 30, 1990 - C.S. 64/6-18 ----- Found - A 1" dia. steel axle protruding 2" above ground. 16" now 35" dia. B.Oak with a previously opened & rehealed blaze bears S.30 ¾°E., 328.0 ft. Orig. BT. (agrees with record) 8" now 18" dia. 2 ft. high rotted oak stump, no blazes or scribing visible, bears N.16½°W., 127.4 ft. orig. BT (Rec. N.16½°W., 126.7 ft.) 22" now 26" dia. 2½ ft. high oak stump with a fully healed double blaze bears N.81½°W., 34.3 ft. (N.81½°W., 33.5 ft.) West power pole now sawed off 1½ ft. above ground (rotted) bears N.19½°E., 8.0 ft (Rec. N.19½°E. 7.5 ft. dist. is to near side of pole) New Accessories: 4" dia. W.Oak, double blazed & scribed "¼ S8 CSBT" bears N.63½°E., 117.7 ft. 10" dia W.Oak, double blazed & scribed "¼ S7 CS BT" bears N.34¼°W., 83.1 ft. continued next page West power pole tagged "PP&L Co 15206" bears N.6½°E. 10.1 ft. to center of pole.</p>
