Set post 50x4" sqr., 20" in the ground for cor. to secs. 29, 32, 31, & 30, marked T 27 S S 29 on NE, R 6 E S 32 on SE, S 31 on SW, and S 30 on NW faces with 1 notch on S & 5 on E edges, from which

- A fir, 6" dia., bears N.25°E., 25 lks., mkd: T27S R6E S29 BT.
- A fir, 8" dia., bears S.45°E., 32 lks., mkd: T27S R6E S32 BT.
- A pine, 20" dia., bears S.14°W., 25 lks., mkd: T27S R6E S31 BT.
- A fir, 8" dia., bears N.12°W., 41 lks., mkd: T27S R6E S30 BT.

Found - No monument found.  
A 26", orig. 20" White Pine bears S.14°W., 16.5 ft. Blaze previously opened, faint scribing visible.  
A 12" White Fir is down, Stump hole bears S.45°W., 21.12 ft. Has a double healed blaze.  
A stump hole bears N.25°E., 16.5 ft.  
No trace of NW BT.

A 14" White Pine bears S.73°E., 46.5 ft. scribed "T27S R6E S32 CS BT" on a double blaze.  
A 20" White Pine bears S.52°W., 33.8 ft. scribed "T27S R6E S31 CS BT" on a double blaze.
