blaze bears S.64°E., 32.2 ft. to root crown,
rec. S.64°E., 31.5 ft. dist. goes to center of
trunk) a 15" dia. D.Fir has grown up 3 ft. in
front of BT. 1958
NEW: 10" dia. B.Oak double blazed & scribed "NW DLC 53 CS
BT" bears N.59°W., 23.2 ft.
11" dia. Madrone double blazed & scribed "NW DLC 53
CS BT" bears S.18½°W., 15.67 ft.
