

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION Cor. Secs. 17, 18, 19 & 20

Alias	Description
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GLO survey by William P. Heydon, Deputy Surveyor, under contract No. 656, dated May 21, 1896 - (DCSO records Vol. 13 Page(s) 5345)

Set yew post, 3 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground for cor. to secs. 17, 18, 19, & 20, marked T27S S 17 on NE, R8W S 20 on SE, S 19 on SW, S 18 on NW faces, with 3 notches on S & 5 notches on E edges; from which

- A fir, 36" dia. bears N.78°E. 37 lks. mkd: T27S R8W S17 BT
- A fir, 36" dia. bears S.58°E. 35 lks. mkd: T27S R8W S20 BT
- A fir, 24" dia. bears S.47°W. 54 lks. mkd: T27S R8W S19 BT
- A hemlock, 30" dia., bears N.32¼°W., 51 lks., mkd: T27S R8W S18 BT.

Weyerhaeuser corner report, no surveyor's name or stamp, no date of visit - C.S. File 58/271-5

Per note on file:

"The attached corners were visited by Douglas Co. crews with insufficient evidence available for remonumenting the corners. Weyerhaeuser information was not based on "found" original evidence and the County crew disagreed with many of Weyerhaeuser's bearing and distance to their set monument." July 1983 V. Laugen - This information added to the corner report on 2/11/2008. DCSO

- 52" Firs stump N.34°E., 24.5 ft.
- 18" Hemlock bears S.72°E., 42.3 ft.
- 40" fir stump N.20½°W., 33.3 ft.

Found - Unrecorded 3/4" I.P. firmly set, protruding 13" out of ground.
Orig. 36" Fir, now 47" stump with two good scars. I open upper blaze and find scribed "T27" 8 V
All other orig. BTs gone. Area logged over.

Set - Using record bearing & distance (S.78°W., 24.4 ft.) from orig. 36" fir, now 47" stump, I SET a 1"x30" IP with brass cap attached marked "Douglas Co. Surveyors Office T27S S18 S17 S19 S20 R8W 1982".
Fd 3/4" I.P. bears S.28°E., 17.3 ft.

New - Spike in top of 37" fir stump bears N.12½°W., 17.7 ft to spike. This stump also has "W" nail in face
Spike in top of 36" fir stump bears S.58°W., 55.3 ft. to spike.
