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Set ¼ sec. post, from which  
A Fir 18" dia., bears S.10°E., 36 lks.  
A Cedar 10" dia., bears N.65°W., 15 lks.

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Point for the standard ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 3, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. This point also becomes the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 34, T27½S R8W.

Set an iron post 28" long, 2½" dia., 22" in the ground, with brass cap mkd:

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Found - A 2½" o.d. iron pipe by White, Jelley and Jelley in 1961, firmly set, projecting 11" above the ground in a mound of stone with a ¾" brass cap (properly) marked

BTs by White, Jelley and Jelley in 1961 -  
A 20"x5' tall metal capped D.Fir stump bears N.73°W. 24.4 ft. with a healed blaze.

A 34"x3' tall metal capped D.Fir stump bears S.41¼°W., 57 4 ft. with a healed blaze.

New - A 9" D.Fir bears N.31°E., 13.4 ft. scribed "¼ S34", "CS BT"

A 10" D.Fir bears S.67°E. 29.2 ft. scribed "¼ S3 SC CS" "BT"

Note - All BTs have BT tags attached. All new BTs have double blazed faces with bearings measured to the center of the tree at the root crown and distances measured to a 2½" PK nail in the side and center of the root crown.

Corner is located on a steep SE slope approximately 260 ft. North of logging access road. Compass dec. 15°E. \_\_\_\_\_
