Epoxyed a brass tablet, 2¾" dia., with a 3" stem, in a hole drilled in solid rock, on top of a prominent rock high point, mkd. WC BQ2-1 BQ3-1 BQ9-1 BQ10-1-MS1008A 1992.

The corner of secs. 2, 3, 10 & 11, T28S R1E WM bears S.27°09'58"W., 3360.53 ft. a 2" dia. iron post, 12" above the ground, firmly set, with a 2½" dia. GLO brass cap properly marked, falls in clearcut area, accessories hereinafter described.
