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Set fir post, 4 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground for cor. to secs. 16, 17, 20, & 21, marked T28S S 16 on NE, R3W S 21 on SE, S 20 on SW, S 17 on NW faces, with 4 notches on E & 3 on S edges; from which  
A fir, 8" dia. bears N.40°E., 18 lks. mkd: T28S R3W S16 BT  
A fir, 20" dia. bears S.65°E. 38 lks. mkd: T28S R3W S21 BT  
A fir, 12" dia. bears S.80°W. 31 lks. mkd: T28S R3W S20 BT  
A hemlock, 10" dia., bears N.10°W., 39 lks., mkd: T28S R3W S17 BT.

GLO survey by Wm. N Gibb, Deputy Surveyor, under contract No. 783, dated Dec. 3, 1908 - (DCSO records Vol. 13 Page(s) 5575)  
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Cor. secs. 16, 17, 20 & 21, which is a stake greatly decayed, marked & witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.  
Set dogwood stake, 3 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground for cor. secs. 16 & 17 marked T28S S16 on NE & R3W S17 on NW face, with 4 notches on E & 2 notches on W edge.  
Bearing trees in secs. 16 & 17 as described.  
I destroy markings on bearing trees referring to secs 20 & 21

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Found - Sec cor to secs. 20|21 checks record bearing & dist  
Also find orig. SE & SW BTs for this corner.

SW BT shows scar, now 24" Cedar not Fir.  
Note - Corner is in 2 lk. stream.  
Set - Wit corner 7.0 ft north - set brass cap at wit. cor. & mkd: COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE 1962 WC S17|S16 T28S R3W 7' S TO COR.  
New BT - 16" hemlock bears N.75°W., 25.0 ft. scribed WC S17 T28S R3W CS BT.  
5" cedar bears N.22½°E., 25.9 ft. scribed S16 CS BT.
