The ¼ sec. cor. determined at record bearing and distance from the original bearing trees, as follows;

A Fir 63" dia., bears N.25°E., 78 lks., with axe marks and illegible scribe marks on a double bark blaze.

A Fir 75" dia., bears N.40°W., 10 lks., with axe marks and a double bark blaze, no scribe marks visible.
