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Set Cedar post for ¼ sec. cor., from which  
Cedar 12" dia., bears S.87°E., 28 lks.  
Cedar 12" dia., bears N.50°W., 20 lks.

BLM resurvey by Zirpel and Glenn under Special Instructions dated Aug. 29, 1957 (DCSO records, Vol. 29 Page 12245)

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The ¼ sec. cor., determined at record distance from two original bearing trees, as follows:

A Cedar 23" dia., bears N.50°W., 20 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.  
A burned and rotted Cedar stump 18" dia., bears S.89½°E., 28 lks. dist., no scribe marks visible. (Rec S.87°E)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd: T28S R4W

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Found - BLM brass cap in place but both bearing trees have been uprooted. This area has been logged recently and no standing trees are left.

New BTs -40" Fir stump bears S.64°E., 21.1 ft. mkd. ¼ S10 BT.  
18" Cedar stump bears N.33°E., 75.6 ft. mkd. ¼ S10 BT.

This corner lies on an East slope, 100 ft. South of a rock road.

BLM resurvey by George M. Winter, Cadastral Surveyors, under Group No. 2704, surveyed July 2013/Feb. 2016 - (DCSO records Vol. 58 page(s) 23356-7)

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The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 10, perpetuated by Holt, in 1981, monumented with an iron post, 2½" dia., firmly set, projecting 6" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.

with scribe marks S 10 BT visible on an open blaze.

A fir, 11" dia., bears S.82 $\frac{1}{4}$ °E., 16.9 ft., mkd. T28S R4W  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  S10 BT.  
A hemlock, 10" dia., bears S.58°W., 3.0 ft., mkd. X BT.
