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Set Fir post for ¼ sec. cor., from which:  
    Fir 36" dia., bears N.43°E., 114 lks.  
    Fir 8" dia., bears S.40°W., 59 lks.

Doug. County Surveyors Office - James Byron, Deputy - April/ May 1957 - C.S. File 47/180

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Found - Orig. SW BT, now 36" stump. I open & find scribing "¼S".  
    The NE BT gone.  
Set an I.P. with brass cap at cor. mkd: " ¼ S 15|14 T28S R4W County Surveyor's Office, 1957". From which  
    8" Cedar bears S.10°E., 31.5 ft. I scribe ¼ S14 CS BT.  
    12" R.Fir bears N.68½°W., 33.2 ft. I scribe ¼ S15 CSBT.  
Corner falls in roadway. Set brass cap 2" below surface.

Doug. County Surveyors Office - Vernon "Ray" Tracy; Jack Heritage - Aug. 25, 1966 - C.S. File 49/67-40

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Found - Brass cap, set 2" below surface of old unused portion of road.  
    8" now 11" R.Cedar S.10°E., 31.5 ft., blaze nearly healed over.  
    Stump of Orig. BT to SW.  
    NW BT taken out in new road construction.  
New BT - 7" Hemlock S.37½°W., 42.7 ft. mkd: ¼ S15 CS BT.  
Since old road will no longer be used, we leave brass cap uncovered and in circle with rocks.

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Found ¼ cor. perpetuated and recorded by Byron, 1957, and perpetuated and recorded by Tracy, 1966, and perpetuated by George W. Plumb, R.L.S. #862, date unknown; monumented with an iron post 1½" dia., firmly set 4" below the surface of an abandoned road, 15 lks. wide, bears NE and SW, and properly mkd. brass cap.

    A Fir stump 31" dia., bears S.40°W., 59 lks. dist.,  
        with scribe marks ¼ S visible on an opened blaze.  
and a bearing tree mkd. by Byron  
    A Cedar 22" dia., bears S.11°E., 48 lks. dist.,

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and a bearing tree mkd. by Plumb  
A Cedar 13" dia., bears N.85 3/4°E., 48 lks. dist., with  
scribe marks ¼ S14 LS 862 BT.  
and a new bearing tree  
A Hemlock 17" dia., bears S.22°W., 64 lks. dist.,  
mkd. ¼ S15 BT.
