Set post to ¼ sec. corner, from which
A Laurel 10" dia., bears N.50°E., 23 lks. dist.
A Fir 24" dia., bears S.60°W., 35 lks. dist.

Set with 10" x 14" x 20" sandstone from original BT.
Laurel 24" dia., bears N.50°E., 32.1 lks.
Fir 38" dia., bears S.60°W., 35.0 lks.
Chiseled ¼ S. C.S. on S face of sandstone. The Laurel was 32 lks. distance, instead of 23 lks. Remarked old bearing tree

Doug. County Surveyors Office - James Byron, Deputy - Milo Godfrey; S.A. Bilow - April 7, 1959 - C.S. File 49/64-6

Found - 10" x 14" x 20" stone, mkd. as recorded. I find stone out of place, down hill & south of true corner. this section in slide area.
Now 40" Fir stump S.60°W., 23.1 ft. shows good bark scribed "ss".
Now 30" Laurel N.56°E., 21.1 ft., should be N.50°E., 21.1 ft. I do not open.
Reset stone at corner. Checks call to small creek.
North-South fence 20 ft. East - Reset stone to true position.
New BTs- 9" R.Fir, N.24°E., 18.9 ft. scribed ¼ S23 CS BT.
7" R.Fir, N.80°W., 54.5 ft. scribed ¼ S22 CS BT.

BLM resurvey by Bedell and Peterson, under Group #1425, Survey April 1988-April 1990 (DCSO records, Vol. 49 Page 18707)

The ¼ sec. cor., perpetuated and recorded by B. Irving, 1938, and further perpetuated and recorded by Byron, 1959, monumented with a sandstone, 20 x 14 x 10 inches, firmly set 12" in the ground, mkd. ¼ S on W. face, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:
A Madrone 30" dia., bears N.58°E., 32 lks. dist.
no marks visible on an open, rotted blaze. (Rec. N.50°E., 23 lks.)
A Fir stump 39" dia., bears S.58°W., 35 lks. dist.,
no visible marks. (Record S.60°W.)
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
