An Ash 9" dia., bears S.65°E., 83 lks. dist.

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Pointed rock set in ground. Original BTs rotted away. I checked to holes where they stood and remark new BTs as follows:  
A B.Oak 9" dia., bears 121.5 lks., (Direction of N.17°W. was reported by Milo Godfrey, Dec. 18, 1959)  
A W.Oak 4" dia., bears S.34°15'E., 31 lks.

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Found - Stone, top measures 5"x8", protrudes 15" above ground. Stone monument is firmly set, in good condition.  
9" now 25" dia. B. Oak with a fully healed double blaze, bears N.17°W, 80.2' (agrees with rec). (Note, 10" W. Oak growing at base on blaze side of tree). 1923 DCSO.  
4" now 11" double trunked W. Oak with a fully healed blaze, NE trunk bears S.34¼°E., 20.5' (agrees with rec.) 1923 DCSO.  
New BTs - 12" dia. W. Oak, double blazed and scribed "1/4 S3 CS BT", bears N.42½°W, 2.7'.  
12" dia. W. Oak, double blazed and scribed "1/4 S2 CS BT", bears S.16°E., 33.1'.
