Original - Elder and Gile, under Contract #31 dated April 7, 1853 (DCSO records, Vol. 14 Page 5736)  
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Set post cor. to sec. 17, 18, 19 and 20, from which  
    A Y.Oak 24" dia., bears N.88½°W., 1444 lks. dist.  
    A W.Oak 18" dia., bears S.86½°W., 1500 lks. dist.  
    Made trench, no other trees near.

Ben B. Irving, Deputy - Wit: Chas Buxton - Sept. 1922 - Vol. 3 Pg. 140A; C.S. File 5/14; "old" cor. book, Pg. 109  
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No evidence of orig. corner. Ran line from ¼ cor. common to sections 17 and 18 to cor. common to secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30. Set 1" Iron pipe on line at distance proportional to that shown in original notes. No trees available.  
    Point on south edge of large rock outcrop N.44°37'W., 191.5 ft.  
    High point on rock outcrop S.84°30'E., 790 ft.  
    North end of gable on Wm. Buxton's barn S.66°40'E.  
    No other points available.

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Found - Rock outcrops and barn as recorded by B.B.I. 1922. ¾" I.Rod bears N.44°W., 5.0 ft. May have been set for corner.  
Set brass cap at cor. mkd: County Surveyors S18|S19 T28SR6W Office, 1961 S19|S20  
Chiseled 2" + on rock outcrop N.79°W. 54.0 ft. Also chiseled B.O. on rock just west of corner.  
No trees near.

Doug. County Surveyors Office - Randall Smith; Stephen Flaese April 28, 1988 - C.S. file 62/52-9  
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Found - 1962 DCSO 2½" dia. Brass cap on a 1½" I.P. protruding 10" above a 3 ft. mound of stone.  
¾" Iron rod protruding 1" above ground. Source unknown, bears N.46°W., 4.2 ft. from DCSO BC/IP. (Rec. N.44°W., 5.0 ft. per Byron)  
1" Iron pipe per Irving, not found.  
(Measurements taken to DCSO BC/IP Orig BTs looked for/not fd)  
North end of gable on old barn bears S.66¾°E.  
14 ft long x 8 ft. wide x 4 ft. high at highest point, rock outcrop bears N.44½°W., 191.5 ft. to south edge (agrees well with record.)  
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14 ft. long x 4 ft. wide x 6½ ft. high to highest point rock outcrop bears S.84½°E., 783.0 ft. to highest point. (Rec. N.84½°E., 790 ft.)  
3½ ft. x 3 ft. x 8" high rock outcrop with chiseled "+" on top bears N.81°W., 54.0 ft. to "+". (Rec. N.79°W., 54.0 ft.)  
Chiseled B.O. on rock west of corner, not found.  
Note: DCS0 BC/IP is a "point of survey" as determined by B.B. Irving in 1922 and perpetuated by Byron. Survey point set by single proportion not according to the prescribed methods of the Manual of Survey Instruction to reestablish a four-way section corner. We perpetuate this position as an important survey point that has been in existence since 1922. (See DCS0 records Vol. 3 Pg. 140A and C.S. File 5/14)  
No new accessories. Corner lies in an open pasture.
