    Leaning Laurel 8" dia., bears N.25°E., 14 lks. dist.  
    A Fir 24" dia., bears S.30°W., 26 lks. dist.

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At the position of the ¼ cor. secs. 24 & 19, a further search made for orig. bearing trees. There was no definite evidence found so the ¼ cor. post was set midpoint on true line between section corners.  
Set 1½" Iron pipe, 3 ft. long was driven 2 ft. in ground.  
New BTs- Hemlock 22", bearing East 28.8 ft., measured to center of tree and scribed ¼ S19 BT.  
    D.Fir stump 48", bearing S.52°W., 25.9 ft. measured to nail in face and scribed ¼ S24 BT.

New BTs- 10" D.Fir bears N.15°E., 28.4 ft. scribed ¼ S19 BT.  
    7" Tan Oak bears East 10.6 ft. scribed ¼ S19 BT.  
    12" D.Fir bears S.14°W., 17 ft. scribed ¼ S24 BT.  
    14" D.Fir bears S.66°W., 21.9 ft. scribed ¼ S24 BT.

    18" D.Fir tall stump, 6' tall, S.69°W., 21.84'.

We set a Yew wood post 2' South and painted the top in blue.
