Found original NW. BT, now 24" Hemlock, open face, scribe marks "B". Also, found Corner Tree, now 20" Hemlock and SE. BT. All BTs are down, have been uprooted within the last few years. Scribing found only on the NW. BT. All check for bearing and distance.

The 1/4 sec. cor. perpetuated and recorded by Byron in 1957. Byron found the root hole of the original corner, a down Hemlock 20" dia., alongside, with no marks visible, the corner is monumented with an iron pipe 2" dia., firmly set, protruding 2" above the ground, in the center of the root hole, with brass cap mkd. in 1957

from which the remains of the original bearing tree:

A root hole bears S.68°E., 31 lks. dist.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Byron:

A sawed Fir stump 60" dia., bears S.52°E., 106 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S8 CS BT visible on open blaze.

A sawed Hemlock stump 10" dia., bears N.79°W., 109 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on bark blaze.

and new bearing trees:

A Fir 60" dia., bears S.67°E., 121 lks. dist. mkd. 1/4 S8 BT.

A Hemlock 4" dia., bears S.72°W., 89 lks. dist., mkd. X BT.

Corner falls on East edge of dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
