A fir, 9" dia., bears S.66°W., 14 lks mkd: T29S R1E S26 BT  
A fir, 18" dia. bears N.17°W., 18 lks mkd: T29S R1E S23 BT

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Found - An orig. 18" now 28" sugar pine, alive and in good condition with healed blazes on the NE, SE. SW, and NW faces and 2 notches on the south side and 1 notch on the east side. From which:  
An orig. 9 Fir, now dead and down, bears N.31°E., 9.2 ft. scribing visible on rotting face.  
An orig. 18" now 23" D.Fir, bears S.53°E., 7.9 ft. well healed.  
An orig. 9" Fir, now dead and down bears S.66°W., 9.2 ft. found scribing on wood fragments near rotted stump of BT.  
An orig. 18" now 23" D.Fir, bears N.17°W., 11.9 ft. alive and well healed.  
New BTs- An 11" Incense cedar bears N.58°E 30.0 ft. scribed T29S R1E S24 CS BT.  
An 18" D.Fir bears S.82°W., 16.3 ft. scribed "T29S R1E S26 CS BT"  
Compass declination setting: 20°East
