

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION Cor. No. 1 HES 144

Alias	Description
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HES No. 144 by Frank D. Maxwell, surveyor (FS), under special instructions dated April 27, 1914 - Surveyed June 1914 - DCSO records Vol. 28 Page(s) 12033-4

Cor. No. 1, identical with Cor. H/3 of listing survey No. 6-605, which is a fir tree, 24" dia., mkd. and witnessed as described by Asher Ireland, Assistant Forest Ranger. I mark tree 1 HES 144 on SE. face, with a blaze on the S & NE faces; from which -

- A fir, 15" dia., brs. N.18°30'E., 23 lks.
- A hemlock, 9" dia., brs S.30°30'W., 38 lks., both blazed and scribed 1 HES 144 BT.

Cor. of secs. 12 and 13, T29S R1W., WM a stone, mkd. and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, brs N.78°29'W 145.91 chs. Pits and mounds impracticable at this and all other cors.

- Found - Orig. 24" now 34" D.Fir corner tree, alive, shows good axe scar & frag. bark scribe of Asher Ireland.
- Orig. 15" now 24" D.Fir N.18½°W., 15.2 ft. shows good axe scar, we tag.
- Orig. 9", now 20" Hemlock, down, lying almost face down, shows scar, S.30½°W., 25.1 ft. remains of stump in place.

At a point 3.0 ft. E of center of corner tree, set brass cap at cor. mkd: COUNTY SURVEYORS T29S R1E OFFICE, 1969 COR #1 HES 144

New BT - 10" Hemlock S.47°W., 19.5 ft. mkd: "1 HES 144 CS BT" This corner lies on NE slope of hill, bear. & dist. from Cor. Tree.

- Found - 24" now 36" dia. 36" high D.Fir stump with healed blazes on four sides. (Original) Stump is sound.
- 15" now 26" dia. 3½ ft. high D.Fir stump with a fully healed single blaze, bears N.18½°E., 15.2 ft. (agrees with original record. Bearing mix-up in prior renewal. (1969)

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TOWNSHIP 29 RANGE 01E POINT IDENTIFIER # 944010

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9" now 10" dia. 1 ft high rotted Hemlock stump, no scribing or blazes visible, bears S.30½°W., 25.1 ft.. Orig. BT.

10" now 13" dia. Hemlock with a partially healed single blaze illegible scribing visible, bears S.44°W., 19.5 ft (Record, S.47°W., 19.5 ft) 1969

2½" dia. DCSO brass cap on a 1⅜" O.D. Iron pipe protruding 15" above ground is marked "T29S HES 144 BO Cor #1 R1E 1969", bears S.78°E., 2.5 ft. (Rec. East 3.0 ft. (1969)

New BTs- 6" dia. D.Fir double blazed and scribed "1 HES 144 CS BT" bears S.8°W., 13.6 ft.

15" dia. Hemlock double blazed and scribed "1 HES 144 CS BT bears N.17°W., 19.6 ft.
