

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION Cor. No. 12 Tract B; HES 179

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Set a lava stone, 24x12x6", 14" in ground, over a stone mkd with a cross for cor. No. 12 of this survey, marked 12 HES 179 on side facing the claim; from which

A fir, 12" dia., bears N.45°30'E., 19 lks., mkd X 12 HES 179 BT.

A fir, 14" dia., bears S.63°15'W., 12 lks., mkd X 12 HES 179 BT.

Raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, 3½ ft., within the claim.

Cor. No. 4 of Tract A bears S.65°55'W., 1.37 chs.

Probably destroyed by road - & river course change

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Found - The original corner stone (6x12x24") was found (mkd: with an "X" and "12 HES 179"); however, it was out of place, apparently disturbed by logging activities. No bearing tree evidence was fd. The proportioned corner point was monumented with a brass cap monument, and one bearing tree was blazed and scribed. No other trees nearby were suitable for a bearing tree.

Set - 1"x36" galv. pipe with a 2½" brass cap stamped: "T29S R1E COR 12 HES 179 RPLS 1017 1976" A memorial stone, mkd "X" set under the galv. pipe. (The orig. corner stone buried alongside) from which bears

A 8" D.Fir N.81°30'E., 33.0' scribed "12 HES 179 X BT"

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Found - 2½" dia. brass cap attached to a 1" iron post, firmly set, projecting 8" above a 3 ft. dia. mound of stone, brass cap mkd as shown on M65-77. 1976

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TOWNSHIP 29 RANGE 01E POINT IDENTIFIER # 979120

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18" D.Fir bears N.81°30'E., 33.0 ft. with a healed single blaze. This tree was also identical to a bearing tree for corner 13.  
Corner 13 of HES 179 bears N.65°50'26"E., 55.10 ft. which is a 2½" brass cap on a 1" dia. iron post. Brass cap is marked as shown on M65-77.  
New BT - 5" D.Fir bears N.45°20'W., 8.0 ft. scribed "X" "BT" on a double blaze.  
Note - New bearing trees have a 3/4" dia. brass washer, stamped L.S. 2150 nailed flush to the face of the "BT" blaze.
