GLO survey by Fred Mensch & Lincoln E Wilkes, U.S. Cadastral Engineers, under Special Instructions dated Dec. 21, 1920 - (DCSO records Vol. 25 Page(s) 10752)

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1" dia., 27" in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap marked

- A D.Fir, 28" dia., bears N.9°E., 40 lks., mkd: 1/4 S4 BT.
- A S.Pine, 24" dia., bears S.64°W., 30 lks., mkd: 1/4 S9 BT.

Found - A 1926 US GLO brass cap properly marked, on a 1"x36" Iron pipe, is loosely set, leaning northwest and protruding 12" from ground.

The Orig. 28" D.Fir is now a 28"x42" high D.Fir stump bearing N.08°E., 25.8 ft. (Rec. N.09°E., 26.4 ft.) This tree has a healed single blaze, upon opening the lower part of this blaze, a scribed "BT" is found.

The orig. 24" Sugar pine is now a 24"x42" high Sugar pine stump bearing S.61°W., 19.2 ft. (Rec. S.64°W., 19.8 ft.) The blaze on this stump has apparently rotted off, no scribing found.

Also a 40"x50" D.Fir stump is fd bearing S.50°E., 14.8 ft. This stump is tagged with a Forest Service location tag posted July 6, 1953. This stump is not blazed or scribed.

Set - Because of monuments loosened condition the orig. location is determined by intersecting the orig. bearings and distances as measured from the fd orig. BT stumps; this position is referenced out, the loose cap is removed and then reestablished firmly at the referenced position. Pipe and cap now protrude 6" from soil and is approx. 0.8 ft. SW of found position.

BTs - Orig. BTs (now stumps) are now fd at orig, record bearings & distances and the southeast bearing 40" x 50" high D.Fir stump now bears S.52½°E., 14.0 ft. Because no other suitable BTs are available and the found stumps are reasonable sound these stumps are tagged with DCSO tags & no new accessories are added.
