37 CS BT. This BT is at top of North bank of  
Myrtle Creek.

A 32"x4' tall D.Fir stump bears S.36½°W., 225.6 ft.  
with a healed blaze

A 31" I.Cedar bears N.58°W, 35.0 ft with healed  
blaze

A ¾ I.R. Flush with the ground bears N.25°W. 56.8 ft

New - A 11" I.Cedar bears N.36°E., 16.6 ft. scribed "SE  
DLC 37" "CSBT"

A 6" D.Fir bears S.2¾°W., 104.8 ft. scribed "SE DLC  
37 CS" "BT"

The SE corner of metal barn bears N.12½°W., 178.5 ft

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Note - All BTs have BT tags attached. All new BTs have double blazed faces with bearings measured to the center of the tree at the root crown and distances measured to the side and center of the root crown to a 2½" PK nail.  
Compass declination 15° E.
