Set Laurel post for the cor. to secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9, from which

- A Laurel 12" dia., bears N.55°E., 50 lks. dist.
- A Cedar 48" dia., bears S.80°E., 14 lks. dist.
- A Laurel 6" dia., bears S.66°W., 16 lks. dist.
- A Laurel 14" dia., bears N.40°W., 42 lks. dist.

The corner is gone but three of the orig. BTs are there and check for bearing and distance with the notes. One Madrone is unmarked, the Cedar is a stump cut below the possible marking. The other Madrone is faced but without a discernable scribe.

I drive a 2" pipe for the corner point and rewitness the corner as follows:

- Madrone 10" bears S.66°W., 12.2 ft. (Orig.)
- Madrone 16" DBH, bears S.45°E., 9.0 ft. (New)
- Madrone 10" DBH, bears N.66°E., 50.0 ft. (New)
- Fir 20" DBH, bears N.35°W., 12.4 ft. (New)

BLM Resurvey by James E. Jelley and Lynn Roseberry Cadastral Surveyors under Group #554 - Surveyed May 1966/Oct. 1967 - (DCSO records Vol. 34 Page(s) 14046)

The sec. cor., perpetuated and recorded by Hootman in 1961, monumented with an iron pipe, 2" dia., firmly set, extending 3" above ground, from which the remaining original bearing trees:

- The burned remains of a Cedar snag, orig. size indeterminate, now a 28" dia., bears S.80°E., 18 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Rec. 14 lks.)
- A Madrone 12" dia., bears S.66°W., 17½ lks. dist., remarked by Hootman S8BT. (Rec. 16 lks.)
- The shell of a Madrone 24" dia., bears N.35°W., 42 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Rec. N.40°W)

and bearing trees mkd. by Hootman:

- A Madrone 13" dia., bears N.66°E., 76½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S4 BT visible on open blaze.
- A Madrone 17" dia., bears S.45°E., 14 lks. dist., with scribe marks S9 BT visible on open blaze.
- A Fir 21" dia., bears N.35°W., 17½ lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Cont. Next Page)
