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Set ¼ sec. post, from which  
A Red Fir 24" dia., bears S.27°E., 40 lks. dist.  
A Red Fir 20" dia., bears N.33°W., 60 lks. dist.

Feb. 3, 1902 - Volume 2 Pages 117 & 264 - Presence of A.M. Akers and C.D. Fallan

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The original BT destroyed by being cut down.  
Set new post Fir 4x4" sq., 3½ ft. long, from which  
Fir 20" dia., bears N.44½°E., 50 lks.  
Fir 16" dia., bears S.10½°W., 23 lks.

30" R.Fir bark scribed "¼ S23 CS", N.72°W., 8.0 ft.  
20" Fir stump S.52°E., 13.2 ft. shows good bark scribing.  
New BT - 8" W.Fir bears S.66°E., 16.9 ft. scribed ¼ S24 CS BT

BLM Resurvey by James E. Jelley and Lynn Roseberry Cadastral Surveyors under Group #'s 255; 701; 938 - Surveyed July 1967/Oct 1977 (DCSO records Vol. 39 Page(s) 15863-64)

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The ¼ sec. cor., reestablished by proportionate measurement by Germond and Frear in 1918, monumented with an iron pipe 1¼" dia., firmly set, projecting 4" above ground. There is no remaining evidence of the original corner; therefore, this position is accepted as the corner, from which the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Germond and Frear:  
A sawed Fir stump 31" dia., bears S.52½°E., 21 lks. dist. with scribe marks CS ¼ S BT visible on bark blaze.  
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
