A B. Oak, 10" dia., bears N.33°W., 47 lks.

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Determined by OBTs  
A B.O. 15" dia, bears N.33°E., 30.0', fd. scribe & remarked S5 BT  
A B.O. 15" dia., bears N.27°W., 31.0' remarked S6.  
At corner point found old scribed post  
Set - 1"x30" I.P. from which;  
A Fir, 15" dia., bears S.65°W., 16.8' mkd: S7 BT  
A B.O. 10" dia, bears S.69°E., 32.5' mkd: S8 2880 BT  
Corner lies about 200' North of top of ridge.

New BTs- 5" W. Oak bears S.33°W., 17.3' scribed S7 CS BT.

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Found - Orig. BT 18" B. Oak, N.33°W., 31.0', good scar.

County brass cap was destroyed by clearing operation  
Set - 1"x36" Iron Pipe with 2½" brass cap at dist. and bearing from OBT mkd: T29S R5W ¼ S6 S5 S8 S7 PLS 866 1980.  
New B0s- 5' steel fence post, S.23°12'E., 24.1'  
5' steel fence post, N.44°08'E., 26.0'

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Found - 1980 2½" dia., brass cap on 1½" O.D. iron pipe, protrudes 5" out of ground, per M84-58. (properly marked)

1962 2½" dia., brass cap on a 1½" O.D. iron pipe, protrudes 16" out of ground per 1962 DCS0 renewal, reported as destroyed in 1980.

1962 BC/IP bears N.74°W., 3.8 ft. from 1980 BC/IP  
1980 BC/IP was used on a recent survey, been in place nearly 30 years and set from an orig. BT. In 1980, 1962 BC/IP was reported as destroyed, I have a difficult time believing Ruppert would have missed a BC/IP that extended 16" out of ground, less than 4 ft. from his monumented corner.

In order to stop future confusion we sawed off the brass cap from the 1962 monument.

From 1980 BC/IP

Badly bent metal fence post bears S.24¾°E., 25.0 ft. (rec. S.23°12'E., 24.1 ft.) 1980

Straight metal fence post bears N.40¼°E., 26.0 ft. (rec. N.44°08'E., 26.0 ft.) 1980

Badly rotted 1½ ft. tall burnt oak stump bears N.34¾°W., 31.0 ft. (Rec. N.33°W., 31.0 ft.) 0BT.

1/2" I.R. protrudes 5" out of ground bears S.49½°E., 70.0 ft. (source unknown)

1/2" I.R. protrudes 5" out of ground bears S.66½°E., 112.5 ft. (source unknown)

(Bearing between Fd 1/2" I.R.s is N.89½°E., 50.0 ft)

New - 18" dia., W.Oak single blazed & scribed "X BT" bears N.23½°W., 83.3 ft. (High blazed because of fire scars)

26" dia., Madrone double blazed & scribed "T29S R5W S6 CS BT" bears N.77½°W., 124.5 ft.

28" dia., W.Oak, double blazed & scribed "T29S R5W S8 CS BT" bears S.64°E., 147.5 ft.

Note - Corner lies approx 25 ft. east of a N'ly running draw, in a large patch of black berries. Area around draw shows sign's of being in a slide.  
Compass decl. 16¼°E.
