Set a post marked as per instructions, from which
A B.Oak 10" dia., bears S.12½°E., 30 lks.

Frank Cain - For: Rice Brothers - June 1, 1915 - Field Book 37 Page 46 and "old" corner book, page 194

Chop out original tree. Renew corner with:
Oak post marked C.41 C.S., from which
A W.Oak 7" dia., bears S.10°W., 8 lks.
A W.Oak 7" dia., bears N.37°E., 13 lks.

See survey from the office of L.G. Hicks, March 23, 1918, surveyed by Frear (?) - M 13-76 and C.S. File 37/4. From information supplied to me, no new BTs were set. Only mention was the original BT listed on sketch in file. (Virginia Laugen, 8/17/94)

Found - Both old W.Oak BTs, check for bearings and distances
We cut out, 8" W.Oak, S.10°W., 5.3 ft. scribed CS C
41 BT., good condition.
Old BTs alive and standing.
Set 3/4" x 30" bolt (square head) at corner.
Blazed and scribed: 10" W.Oak S.40°E., 3.0 ft., C 41 CS BT.

The NE cor. of Claim No. 41, perpetuated and recorded by F.C. Frear, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1917, from original evidence no longer in existence, further perpetuated by Byron in 1954, monumented with an iron bolt, 1/2" dia., firmly set, protruding 8" above ground, from which bearing trees marked by Frear in 1917

A W. Oak 10" dia., bears N.37°E., 13 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.
A W. Oak 8" dia., bears S.17°W., 9 lks. dist., with scribe marks CS C41 BT visible on opened blaze.
and a bearing tree marked by Byron in 1954
A W.Oak 10" dia., bears S.40°E., 5 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.
