Found - A 2½" dia., brass cap (properly mkd) on a 1½" O.D. galv. iron pipe firmly set and protruding 10" above ground. Monument is 1 ft. westerly from 7 ft. tall 5" dia., pressure treated wood fence, corner post with fences running east and S.64°W.
A W.Oak 18" dia., now a 36" DBH W.Oak with a partially re-healed previously opened blaze showing a now rotted face with no scribing visible, bears N.88½°E., 196.0 ft. (Orig. record S.89½°E., 246.1 ft. which was revised to S.89½°E., 196.0 ft. when scribing was fd. in 1962 renewal) Orig.

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A large isolated rock reasonably described as measuring 13x3½x4 ft. high. The high near center of which bears S.43½°W., 95.0 ft. (as per record) 2" "+" marked on rock in 1962 is not found (Surface of rock has weathered).

A 10" W.Oak now an 11" DBH W.Oak with a fully healed single blaze, bears S.67½°E., 134.8 ft. (as per rec) 1962

New - A "K.M.X" pine 11" DBH scribed "X CS" "BT" on a double blaze with "X CS" blaze beginning 2½ ft. above the lower blaze bears N.46½°W., 163.2

Note - Monument is in open pasture at edge of nearly flat area and near top of gentle northerly slope. Monument is approx. 100 ft. east from Skyline Dr East R/W fence.
