14" Cedar bears S.20°E., 7.7 ft., healed face.
6" D.Fir bears N.7°E., 14.8 ft. is uprooted, shattered and out of position.
34" Fir now stump, bears N.77°W., 48.8 ft. Lower blaze partially visible.
New BT - 6" D.Fir bears N.54°E., 25.3 ft. and scribed "¼ S22 BT"
