Set post corner secs. 5, 6, 7, & 8. Built stone mound from which

- An Oak, 18" dia., bears S.80°W., 42 lks.
- A fir, 6" dia., bears S.45°E., 75 lks.
- An Oak, 3" dia., bears N.56°E., 14 lks.
- A pine, 50" dia., bears N.54°W., 110 lks.

The old corner which was a post has disappeared and only indistinct remains of the mound of stone are found. The oak described as a BT in sec. 7 is still standing with marks yet distinguishable. The other BTs have fallen & decayed.

I destroy the old marks & reestablish the corner in its orig. position, as follows:

Set a basalt stone, 18x10x8" 12" in the ground, for corner of secs. 5, 6, 7, & 8, marked with 5 notches on S & E edges, from which

- A R.Fir, 15" dia., bears N.65°E., 18 lks., mkd: T30S R1W S5 BT.
- A R.Fir, 18" dia., bears S.68°E., 89 lks., mkd: T30S R1W S8 BT.
- A R.Fir, 10" dia., bears S.70°W., 44 lks., mkd: T30S R1W S7 BT.
- A R.Fir, 8" dia., bears N.10°W., 46 lks., mkd: T30S R1W S6 BT.

Found - 18x10x8" Corner Stone.

15", now 22" R.Fir, N.65°E. 11.9 ft. shows good face  
18", now 22" R.Fir Snag, S.68°E. 58.7 ft., opened & found scribe "B".

10", now 20" R.Fir, S.70°W. 28.3 ft. (Record 46.2 ft., shows good face

8", now 18" R.Fir, N.10°W. 30.4 ft shows a good face
