Set a basalt stone 15x10x8 ins., 10" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ on N. face, from which
A Cedar 20" dia., bears N.59°E., 5 lks. mkd. ¼ S33 BT.
A Fir 24" dia., bears S.51°W., 11 lks. mkd. ¼ S4 BT

The corner which I established under contract No. 757, as the ¼ sec. cor. bet. secs. 4 & 33, bears N. 20 lks. dist., I destroy marks on corner and bearing tree.

Set 2" x 30" I.Pipe with 3" brass cap properly stamped and with PLS 483 marked, from which new BTs:
18" I.Cedar N.6½°E., 64.4 ft. mkd. "¼ 33 BT".
11.2" P.Pine S.2¼°W., 32.9 ft. mkd. "¼ S4 BT".
Original cor. not found. Proportionate cor. falls in center of paved road and is set 6" below surface.

Found - Monument as described in 1975 USFS survey (due to location in traveled land of A/C Rd we do not dig up but find strong magnetic signal which agrees in both bearing and distance to both 1975 references)
A 24" dia. I.Cedar with a fully healed double blaze; bears N.6½°E., 64.4 ft. (as per rec) 1975 USFS
A 20" dia., P.Pine with a fully healed double blaze; bears S.2¼°E., 32.9 ft. (as per rec) 1975 USFS
New - Set directly over 1975 BC/IP monument's magnetic signal just below flush in surface of A/C is a 1 1/8" dia. X 1¾" long drill cap labeled "SURVEY MARK"
Two 1 1/8" dia., x 1¾" long copper drill caps stamped "DOUG. CO. SURVEYOR" are set just below flush in the A/C surface. One is set North 8.0 ft one is set West, 8.0 ft.
A 4"x4" wooden post with a line crossing sign in the N'ly road shoulder; bears West 37.9 ft as indicated on sign
Note - Compass decl. 15¾°E.
