A Fir 4" dia., bears N.31°W., 24 lks.  
A Hemlock 15" dia., bears S.57°E., 24 lks.

GLO survey by Fred Mensch, Deputy Surveyor, under Contract #782, dated Dec. 1, 1908 - (DCSO records Vol. 16 Page(s) 6800 and 6810)

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(Page 6800)  
The ¼ sec. cor. partially obliterated, no trace is found of the post. The bearing trees are standing deeply overgrown.  
(Page 6810)  
I re-establish the old ¼ sec. cor. in its original position as follows:  
Set a basalt stone 18x7x4 ins., 12" in the ground for the ¼ sec. cor. mkd. ¼ on N. face, from which  
A Fir 10" dia., bears N.27°W., 18 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S21 BT  
A Hemlock 18" dia., bears S.57°E., 22 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S28 BT.

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Found - Stone approx. size, firmly in ground, with + on top, no marks visible.

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Found - 2½" dia. 1968 DCSO cap on a 1½" O.D. Iron pipe is firmly set and protrudes 10" above ground.  
Basalt stone set in 1909 retracement and found in 1968, is searched for but not found.

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18" Hemlock now a 24" DBH Hemlock with the scribing  
"¼ 8 BT" partly visible on a previously opened  
double blaze bears S.60°E., 14.5 ft. (Orig.)  
(Rec. S.57°E., 14.5 ft.)  
No evidence of NW. bearing tree found.  
16" Hemlock now a 19" DBH 5½ ft. tall alum. capped  
Hemlock stump with a fully healed double blaze  
bears N.15°W., 13.3 ft. (Rec. N.22°W., 13.3 ft.)  
New BTs- A 3" DBH Hemlock scribed "X BT" on a double blaze  
bears N.50°E., 15.2 ft.  
An 11" DBH Hemlock scribed "¼ S28 CS BT" on a double  
blaze bears S.16½°E., 24.0 ft.  
A double trunked Maple 9" DBH most easterly trunk is  
scribed "¼ S21 CS BT" on a double blaze. The  
root crown of the double trunked tree bears  
N.55°W., 59.6 ft.  
Monument is on steep easterly slope approx. 500 ft. West of  
Salt Creek.
