A Fir 40" dia., bears S.60°E., 21 lks. dist. mkd. 1/4 S9 BT.

40" Fir snag, N.46°E., 9.9 ft., found scribe.

10" Fir S.57°W., 9.0 ft. mkd. 1/4 S9 BT.

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Found - 4" now 15" dia., 10" high Cedar stump, downed tree has healed blazes. Orig. corner tree  
5/8" iron rod protrudes 9" above ground is found along South edge of Cedar stump. 1962  
40" now rotted 6 ft. high D.Fir snag with axe marks and rotted blaze, no scribing visible, bears S.60°E., 13.9 ft. (Agrees with Orig. rec.) OBT  
NE OBT not found.  
13" now 21" dia., D.Fir with a fully healed double blaze, bears N.67°E., 4.6 ft. (Agrees with rec.) 1962  
10" now 13" dia., D.Fir with a fully healed double blaze, bears S.57°W., 9.0 ft. (Agrees with rec.) 1962  
Set - A 7" long nail through a metal washer is set in top of Cedar stump near center. Washer stamped "DCSO 1998"  
14" dia., D.Fir, double blazed and scribed "1/4 S4 CS BT" bears N.17°E., 14.8 ft.  
21" dia., W.Fir, double blazed and scribed "1/4 S9 CS BT" bears S.25°E., 26.9 ft.  
Note - Corner lies in an East-West fence line. See sketch in file.
