Found - Squared burnt pitch knot and rotted snag BT with dim face visible, S.28°E., 44.8 ft.
54" burnt stub with dim faces bears N.38°W., 36.8 ft. as established by G.G. Stewart in 1922.
Set 1" I.Pipe beside pitch knot.
Rescribe-54" burnt O.B.T. stub and
Bark scribe 28" D.Fir N.42°E., 119.9 ft.

Found - A 1" I.P. projecting 6" above the ground as per Thompson in 1962.
A BT by Stewart, 1922, a 60" burned and rotted D.Fir stump bears N.38°W., 36.8 ft., with partial scribe visible.
A BT by Thompson, a 26" D.Fir bears N.42°E., 119.9 ft., with bark scribe mkd. 3683 C ¼ S BT visible.
New BT - 8" D.Fir bears S.42°30'E., 10.3 ft. scribed C¼ S15 BT.
