Fd. Brass cap as per record, R. Brown, May 1993, M 112-76 ABC

Found - From 1948 renewal - A 2½" brass cap improperly marked, (see CS File 64/52 for detail) on a 1¼" O.D. iron pipe firmly set and protruding 12" above ground.
Accessories Found - Evidence of original bearing tree found. A red fir, 18" in dia. now a Fir stump 46" in dia. and 1½ ft. tall. Stump is rotted but has evidence of healing over previously opened blaze (actual blaze face rotted away). This stump bears N.10°E., 62.0 ft. distant as per original record. (This tree was erroneously identified as a red oak in A.R. Evans 1948 renewal)

- two bearing trees from 1948 renewal found.
- An 18" Fir now a 20" dia. 4 ft. tall sound douglas fir stump with a fully healed double blaze bears S.72°W., 26.8 ft. (this agrees with tag from unrecorded 1963 renewal found on BT)
- A 10" fir now a 14" D.B.H. douglas fir snag 60+ ft. tall with a fully healed double blaze bears N.17°E., 16.0 ft. (this agrees with tag from unrecorded 1963 renewal found on BT)

Alias	Description

- A 5" D.B.H. douglas fir scribed "X BT" on a double blaze, bears N.12°E., 35.0 ft. (base of trunk pistol-butted, bearing and distance to center of root crown as per manual of instructions)
- A 19" D.B.H. Madrone, scribed "S SW DLC 43 CS BT" on a double blaze (upper blaze is high, separated from lower blaze by an old partially healed deep saw kerf) Tree bears N.75°E., 47.1 ft.

Note - Monument is just northeast of edge of small bench on crest of northwest running ridge. A logging road traverses this ridge and bench approximately 50 ft. south from corner position. Monument lies 15 ft. south from a random east-west fence line. (old, broken down)
