The ¼ sec. cor. perpetuated and recorded by Markham in 1957, from the original bearing trees, monumented with an iron bar, 1½ x 3½ ins. cross section, protruding 10" above ground, firmly set, in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 6" high, from which the remaining original bearing tree:
A stump hole, bears S.7°E., 45 lks. dist., with fallen and rotted Oak alongside, 30" dia., with scribe marks ¼S visible on opened and rotted blaze.

An Oak, 12" dia., bears S.72½°E., 62.7 ft. with a healed double blaze.
An Oak, 13" dia., bears S.5¾°W., 56.4 ft. with a healed blaze.
A decayed fir stump, 17" dia., bears S.84¾°W., 22.1 ft. with no marks visible on a hollow blaze.

A cedar, 29" dia., bears N.47½°E., 68.6 ft. with a healed blaze.
