Set post cor. to secs. 15, 16, 9 and 10, from which
Laurel 2" dia., bears S.80°W., 9 lks. dist.
Laurel 2" dia., bears S.40°E., 5 lks. dist.
Laurel 8" dia., bears N.40°W., 38 lks. dist.
Red Fir 4" dia., bears N.75°E., 45 lks. dist.

BLM Resurvey Lynn Roseberry, Cadastral Surveyor - Group #649
Aug/Sept. 1967 (DCSO records, Vol. 35 Pages 14341-42)

Point for the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the orig. corner.
At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd:

S 9 | S 10
S 16 | S 15

from which

- A W. Fir 7" dia. bears N.26½°E., 64 lks mkd T30S R6W S10 BT
- A Fir 20" dia., bears S.75°E., 18½ lks mkd T30S R6W S15 BT
- A Fir 25" dia., bears S.63½°W., 36 lks mkd T30S R6W S16 BT
- A Fir 22" dia., bears N.63°W., 46 lks. mkd T30S R6W S9 BT.

From this point a locally established cor. of which I have no record bears S.80°W., 0.31 chs. dist., monumented with an iron bolt, 1" dia., protruding 10" above ground, firmly set from which local bearing trees:

- A shattered Fir 18" dia., bears N.75°E., 4 lks. dist., with scribe marks S10 visible on opened blaze.
- A Madrone 12" dia., bears S.55¼°E., 32½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S15 BT visible on openblaze.
- A shattered Fir 15" dia., bears S.43¼°W., 30 lks. dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.
- A stump hole bears N.72°W., 14 lks. dist., alongside of which is an uprooted Fir 16" dia., with a healed blaze.

Found - A 3¼" dia., 1967 brass cap (properly mkd) on a 2½" iron pipe is firmly set protruding 10" above ground. Monument is set 6" south from the end post of a south running fence.

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An unrecorded monument first described in the 1967 renewal. This is an iron bolt 1" dia., which is found to be a 1 1/8" dia., by 30" long iron bolt, with a 2" dia. Hex head top lying loose and out of position; bearing S.58°W., 13.8 ft. (rec. S.80°W., 20.5 ft.)

We check for orig. BT evidence from the 1967 record position for the iron bolt. At a point approx. N.75°E., 29.7 ft. is a very large roothole on the east edge of which lays a fallen & rotted 20" dia., fir tree. This tree is intact at its 4" dia. We fully examine this tree for 1855 blazing or scribing and find none. No evidence of other OBTs remains.

Possible evidence of one BT fd in 1967; which is related to the 1967 iron bolt position, is a stump hole (no remains of tree) bearing N.72°W., 9.0 ft. (as per rec)

4 - 1967 BTs, from BC

- A W.Fir 7" dia., now a dead, standing 23" dia, breast height G.Fir with no visible blaze evident; bears N.26 1/2°E., 42.2 ft. (as per rec.)
- A fir 20" dia., now a stump hole and fallen 20" dia., fir described in OBT reference above and not any 1967 markings (either) bears approx. S.75°E., 12.2 ft. (as per rec)
- A fir 25" dia., now a fallen, rotted short sawn, 26" dia., fir stump with no markings visible; the stump hole of which bears S.63 1/2°W., 23.8 ft. (as per rec.)
- A fir, 22" dia., now a fallen & rotted fir (partly buried) of indistinct length and dia., but with the clear scribing "T30S R6W" fd; the base of which bears N.63°W., 30.4 ft. (as per rec.)

New -

- A double trunk 8" DBH I.Cedar (size is mkd trunk) scribed "T30S R6W S10 CS" "BT" on a double blaze. The center of the rootcrown of the double bears N.53 1/2°E., 38.9 ft.
- A 10" DBH D.Fir scribed "T30S R6W S15 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.12 1/2°E., 12.0 ft.
- An 18" DBH I.Cedar scribed "T30S R6W S16 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears S.26 1/2°W., 29.6 ft.
- A 7" DBH madrone scribed "T30S R6W S9 CS" "BT" on a double blaze; bears N.18°W., 16.7 ft.

Note - Monument lays on steep forested east slope at north end of south running fence and approx. 400 ft. west & uphill from a graveled BLM road.
