A Fir 24" dia., bears S.22°E., 76 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT.

Found - Orig. 38" now 42" Pine, N.31°E., 22.4 ft., shows "¼" bark scribe, appears very old.

The ¼ sec. cor., perpetuated and recorded by Tracy in 1965, monumented with an iron post 1¼" dia., firmly set, projecting 8" above ground, with properly mkd. brass cap from which the remains of an original bearing tree:

A Pine snag 38" dia., bears N.31°E., 34 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Tracy:

A Fir snag 14" dia., bears S.89°E., 17 lks. dist. with scribe marks ¼ CS visible on partially healed blaze. (Rec. N.89°E.)

and new bearing trees:

A Fir 4" dia., bears S.2½°W., 51 lks. dist. mkd. X BT.

A Fir 10" dia., bears N.3½°W., 58 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S16 BT

From this point, United States Geological Survey triangulation station "BUCK MTN 1942", bears N.23°42'E., 107.62 chs. dist., monumented with a bronze disk, 3" dia., set in concrete, with top mkd. BUCK MTN 1942.
