The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 17, perpetuated by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 1964-65, further perpetuated by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 2007, monumented with an iron post, 1½" dia., firmly set, projecting 5" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of an original bearing tree
Madrone root fragments bear S.32°W., 16.5 ft., with
madrone trunk laying downhill and out of position, 18"
dia., with no marks visible.

and remains of bearing trees mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 1964-65

A cedar stump, 23" dia., bears N.4°E., 29.1 ft., with a
healed double blaze.

A fir, 13" dia., bears S.67¼°W., 23.2 ft., with a healed
double blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office in 2007

A chinquapin, 23" dia., bears S.21½°E., 30.6 ft., with
scribe marks ¼ S17 CS BT visible on open double blazes.

A fir, 8" dia., bears N.57½°W., 22.9 ft., with fragmentary
scribe marks visible on partially healed double blazes.
