A fir, 13" dia., bears S.44°E., 31½ lks., with healed double blaze.

The cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21, & 22, monumented with an iron post, 1¼" dia., firmly set, projecting 9" above ground, with brass cap mkd. as reported in 1975, from which the remains of the orig. BTs  
A pine, 46" dia. bears N.50°E. 8.0 ft with a healed blaze.  
A pine snag, 11" dia., bears S.72°E., 7.9 ft. with fragmentary scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.  
A madrone, 15" dia., bears S.64°W., 20.5 ft. with no marks visible on a hollow decayed blaze.  
A pine 26" dia., bears N.24°W., 27.7 ft. with a healed blaze.  
and a BT mkd. by the Douglas Co. Surveyors Office in 1965, reported by Popken & Carlson  
A fir, 18" dia., bears S.44°E., 20.8 ft. with a healed blaze.

The cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21, & 22, reported by Saveland in March 2008, monumented with an iron post, 1¼" dia firmly set, projecting 8" above ground, with a brass cap (properly) mkd. from which the remains of the BTs reported by Saveland  
A pine, 48" dia., bears N.50°E., 8.0 ft., with a healed blaze and axe marks visible on bark. (Original)  
A decayed pine snag, 11" dia., bears S.72°E., 7.9 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze. (Original)  
A fir, 20" dia., bears S.44°E., 20.8 ft., with a healed blaze.  
A madrone, 16" dia., bears S.64°W., 20.5 ft., no marks visible on a hollowed decayed blaze. (Original)  
A pine, 27" dia., bears N.24°W., 27.7 ft., with a healed blaze and axe marks visible on bark. (Original)
