Set a stone 12x12x10", 8" in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor. mkd. 1/4 on N face, from which

A fir, 13" dia., bears S.38°E., 18 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.

A fir, 12" dia., bears N.28°W., 39 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.

BLM dependent resurvey by Donald R. Beck & C. Albert White, Cadastral Surveyor, under group #350 & 548, surveyed May 1963/July 1964 - (DCSO records Vol. 32 Page(s) 13603-4)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 & 11, monumented with the orig. basalt stone, 10x10x3" loosely set, 3" in the ground, mkd. 1/4 on the S face, from which the remains of the orig. BTs;

A down fir, 24" dia., bears N.28°W., 39 lks., with old axe mks. visible on opened blaze.

A rotted fir stump, 20" dia., bears S.31 1/2°E., 18 lks. with scribe mks. visible on bark, detached from stump. (Record bearing, S.38°E.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28" long, 2 1/2" dia., 22" in the ground, with brass cap marked:

S 11
1964

from which new BTs

A fir, 9" dia., bears N.11 1/2°W., 20 lks., mkd: 1/4 S2 BT.

A hemlock, 10" dia., bears S.62 1/4°E., 26 lks. mkd: 1/4 S11 BT
Deposit orig. corner stone alongside iron post.

BLM Dependent resurvey by A Bert Skeesick Cadastral Surveyor, under Group No. 2300: Admin. file #0906, surveyed July 2006/May 2007 - (DCSO recs Vol 56 Pg 22319 & Plat T30-8 2011)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 11, monumented with on iron post, 2 1/2" dia., firmly set, projecting 7" above ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.

from which the remains of BTs mkd by Beck & White in 1963-1964

A fir, 15" dia., bears S.62 1/4°E., 172 ft., with a healed blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 16 ins. diam,, bears N.11 1/2°W., 13,2 ft. with a healed blaze.

and new bearing tree

A fir, 12" dia., bears N.37 3/4°E., 6.8 ft., mkd 1/4 S2 BT.

The orig. stone, 10x10x3" is buried alongside the iron post.
