A Fir 40" dia., for the ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S. on W. side and from which

A Fir 36" dia., bears N.48°E., 68 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT.

A Fir 14" dia., bears N.80°W., 36 lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT.

Found - 40" Fir is corner, mkd. on West face (good)

36" Fir N.48°E., 68 lks., down.

14" Fir N.80°W., 36 lks., burned, no visible scribe.

Set 1¼" x 24" Iron pipe.

Scribed -6" D.Fir N.68°E., 65.4 ft.

20" D.Fir S.7°E., 41.0 ft.

No trees in the West to scribe.

BLM resurvey by Stephen D. Albright and Jack W. Bowder, Cadastral Surveyors, under Group #787, surveyed July/Aug. 1972 - (DCSO records Vol. 35 Page(s) 14885)

The original ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 24, occupied with the remains of the original corner tree, now a Fir snag, 55" dia., with scribe marks S ¼ visible on W. face.

from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole bears N.48°E., 58 lks. dist. with a fallen Fir, 39" dia., alongside, no marks visible.

A sawed Fir stump 24" dia., bears N.80°W., 36 lks. dist., no marks visible on rotted blaze.

from which a reference monument and new bearing tree:

An iron post, 28" long, 2½" dia., set 24" in the ground, for a reference monument, bears N.45°E., 20 lks. dist., with brass cap mkd. ¼ S19 RM 1972 and an arrow pointing to the corner.

A Fir 5" dia., bears N.65°W., 100 lks. dist. mkd. X BT.

Found - 55" fir snag cor. tree.

1¼" I.P. on west side.

2½" brass cap, ref. mon. N.45°E., 13.2 ft.

24" fir S.7°E., 41.0 ft. good scar.

26" fir N.65°W., 66' X vis

Note - Corner is approx. 250' west of rd on west slope.
